This term our learning will be based around the theme of
'The United Kingdom'

Children will learn about the following...

Maths: Children will recognise place value of each digit in a 3 digit number. They will order and compare digit numbers, and use mental and formal methods to add numbers up to 3 digits.

English: Children will use the book stimulus The Tunnel by Anthony Browne to understand different story elements and use this to write narratives based on the theme. Children will research the changes in our local area and use this to write a non-chronological report.

Science: Light and reflection. Children will learn what shadows are and investigate what happens to shadows when light sources move.

Geography: Children will learn about how some of the major cities in Britain have changed during recent history.

History: Children will learn about the changes in Britain and British culture, linked to Black History Month.

Art/DT: Children will work on the skill of sculpture. They will use the stimulus of fruit to produce sketches and papier-mâché sculptures.

PE: fitness

RE: stories of religious leaders

Computing: e-safety

Music: Three Little Birds (Charanga)

Spanish: numbers and greetings
